## Annual Presentation & Gala Dinner for 2020



Unlike the Euro's and Tokyo Olympics pigeon racing did take place in 2020 but, the planned presentation for February 2021 had to be delayed until Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> October due to the lockdown restrictions. So when members of the BICC gathered for the presentation, they did so in Torquay on a lovely Indian summer weekend at the Imperial Hotel.

After members took their seats in the ballroom, club president, Mark Gilbert, opened proceedings by welcoming everyone to the presentation. He commented on how strange the last 18 months had been and how good it felt for everyone to be able to socialise once again. A sentiment that seemed to be felt by everyone present. Mark continued by saying, "When the pandemic hit, I don't think anyone thought we would be racing in 2020. I would like to say a massive thank you to the RPRA and our guest of honour Ian Evans, who unfortunately can't make it tonight. He did an excellent job putting the protocols in place and making pigeon racing the first sport back after lockdown. He also gave great advice and was a massive help for us gaining Channel racing in 2020. I would also like to thank the committee for being so positive in their approach towards racing in 2020, the people who run the marking stations, the convoyers and the all the members. All this hard work resulted in a record send of over 8,000 pigeons to our first race."

As Mark said, Ian Evans wasn't able to make the presentation but Ian asked Mark to speak on his behalf. So Mark continued, "Firstly, please accept my apologies for not being with you tonight. I was looking forward to attending the presentation evening to celebrate the achievements of the BICC and its members. 2021 was a challenging season for us all. The ongoing pandemic, bird flu and Brexit all had an impact on pigeon racing in the UK. At the start of the 2020 pandemic, pigeon racing was the first competitive sport to get underway, beating multi-billion pound industries such as horse racing to the starting line. A great achievement that was, firstly facilitated by the RPRA but, then delivered at club and federation level by hard working officials and volunteers that we are all indebted too. This placed us in the best possible position to start racing as early as possible in 2021. However, the level of bird flu outbreaks in the UK and mainland Europe were at an unprecedented level. As a result, the UK General License for all bird gatherings was withdrawn, meaning no pigeon racing. Through the relationships built with DEFRA and improved compliance to the requirements of the General License, pigeon racing was the first to be given permission to gather under license conditions.

Achieving Channel racing in 2021, proved far more difficult. The new animal health regulations made it impossible for organisations to facilitate Channel racing. A potentially catastrophic situation! The RPRA immediately started lobbying the relevant authorities. In May we thought that a temporary reprieve was achieved when we were informed that the new animal health regulations were to be subject to a six month transitional period. Unfortunately, during the transitional period,

member states were able to impose their own national rules, and this is where the French decided to impose rules that proved as onerous as the new EU regulation, meaning no Channel racing. Other possibilities such as racing from Belgium were explored but for a number of reasons this was not possible, including the fact that currently only Caen and Cherbourg ports can deal with the entry of racing pigeons from the UK. No Dutch or Belgian ports are set up to allow entry of pigeons. In other words, the only way to enter mainland Europe was through two French ports.

Now some positive news! My latest announcement in early September detailed the amendments approved by the European Commission to provide exemptions from the Animal Health Regulations and therefore make Channel racing achievable in 2022. I am glad to say that these amendments are now part of the official EU Journal and therefore pigeons are exempt from the requirements that made Channel racing impossible. There may still be some changes to the historic processes and documentation required when entering mainland Europe. DEFRA are currently working with the Commission to establish these requirements; the RPRA will then work with DEFRA to put in place whatever is required and work with organisations and members to implement such requirements. Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mark Gilbert and the BICC committee for their support over the last 18 months."

Those very encouraging words from Ian were greeted with rapturous applause from members. Mark continued by once again thanking Ian and the RPRA for all their hard work and said that the BICC would be putting a Channel programme together for 2022.

Mark said, "Jan was the wife of Albie, our Chairman, and was secretary of our club for 10 years and was a massive part of the reason why the club has done so well. I would personally like to thank Jan for all the work that she did for the BICC. "Mark then proposed a toast to Jan's memory.

Mark then moved on to thank those who have worked so hard to make the club a success. He said, "Firstly, I would like to thank all the ICs at the marking stations who came out in their PPE who ran the stations during the pandemic. Secondly, thanks to Mike Jackson, our new Press Officer. What a find Mike has been, he has done an excellent job keeping the BICC in the press and keeping our members informed, as well as his great race reports. To Alibe Deacon, our chairman, and the man in charge of our transport. He is often the last one at our marking station at midnight, organising the loading of crates. To Carol Francis, our secretary, who always does an amazing job, she is brilliant with all the members, and I don't know how she gets the results in the books so quickly. Russell Bradford, our treasurer, who does a lot more than just the treasurers' job. He organises the handbook, feeds all the information to our press officer, Mike, and to Doug who runs our social media, plus a lot more. And to Doug Gatland, who does an exceptional job on our Facebook page, keeping the members fully informed on what's going on. And last but not least, Trevor Cracknell and Troy Birch who were our convoyers for 2020, as normal they did an excellent job, meaning the birds came back in an unbelievable condition upon return." And with that, Mark said Grace and the members enjoyed a wonderful four course meal.

Following the meal, Carol began the trophy presentation. As usual Carol ran the presentation with her usual skill and efficiency and all members who were present to collect their trophies received a fantastic round of applause. Carol was supported to present the trophies by invited guest, Lee Fribbins editor of the Racing Pigeon, Mrs Catherine Cooper and Rachel Bacon.

Although all the trophies that were presented were very special, the two new trophies deserve an extra special mention. Mark had spoken about the sad passing of Jan Deacon and a new trophy was presented in her memory. The Jan Deacon Celebration Cup was presented, very fittingly, to Jan and Albie's great friends, Mr and Mrs Mick Bunny. Jan's daughter Carol and son Trevor presented Mick with the trophy for best average from Pau and St.Philbert. The second trophy that was presented for the first time, was the John Tyerman Memorial Trophy. John's trophy was presented by his son, Jonny Tyerman, to John Haynes for the best average in all National races.
