# Annual Presentation and Gala Evening 2023

The weekend of 25<sup>th</sup> February, saw the 2022 prize presentation of the British International Championship Club in Bournemouth. The club were very pleased to welcome the distinguished vet, David Parsons as guest of honour. David has done so much to support the BICC and pigeon sport by working to enable cross channel racing to take place. It was great to welcome David and his wife to the presentation.

The club also welcomed the club sponsor BENZING - Gantner Pigeon Systems GmbH represented by Thomas Zimmermann and Jim Savage. They provided fantastic sponsorship on the clubs return to Channel racing by offering six clocking systems to the winners of each section from the St Philbert race on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2022.

The presentation took place in the Marsham Court Hotel, which opened in 1913, occupying one of two neighbouring houses on the East Cliff. A Mr and Mrs Marsh, who had a ham curing business, originally owned the building and supposedly put together the words Marsh and ham, to create the name. By 1923, demand for the hotel's 13 rooms had become so great that the neighbouring house was bought and linked to provide 41 rooms. Today the hotel boasts 95 rooms.

Mark Gilbert, the club chairman opened the presentation by welcoming the 156 members and guests to the presentation. In his opening comments, he talked about how strange the 2022 season was with the uncertainty over channel racing, the rush to apply for CPH numbers and getting to grips with the new marking procedures. And how, only having one marking station, was far from ideal. But, as soon as the club got up and running, some excellent races were held on the south and north road routes. It also proved that channel racing was possible and the BICC were the first club to cross the English Channel after Brexit, which was something to be proud of.

Mark then continued to thank the committee for being so positive about achieving south road racing. He paid particular thanks to Ian Evans, the then CEO of the RPRA and the RPRA in general for all their work in negotiating channel racing. Mark welcomed and thanked the club's guest of honour, David Parsons, the vet who did so much to make channel racing possible, by working with DEFRA and the RPRA in setting out all the protocols to follow that worked so successfully.

Mark then thanked Clare Norman, who joined the committee as treasurer halfway through the season and thanked out going treasurer, Russel Bradford, for his valued contribution over many years. Clare, Mark said, had such a good understanding of the new procedures and was able to organise the marking station so well, that she ensured it run so smoothly. To a rousing applause, Mark said, "Clare without you, we simply could not have done it!"

Mark also thanked, Jill Rogers, the club president who worked so hard alongside Clare to make the season a success and to organise the marking station. It was great to see everyone come together and make the first channel race happen, he said.

Mark then thanked Carol Francis, the club secretary for continuing to do an amazing job with the membership and working so hard on race weekends. To Doug Gatland for running Facebook and keeping the membership fully advised and to Mike Jackson, the press officer, for keeping the membership updated in the pigeon papers and for writing some great race reports. To Trevor Cracknel, the chief convoyer, for doing an excellent job of looking after the birds in transport, which he has done for the past 40 years. Some record! All officers were loudly applauded for their work over the season.

Before inviting Michael Potts to say Grace, Mark finally commented that the club learned so much in 2022 that it will run nine marking stations in 2023 with a great understanding the procedures to make it a season to remember.

The members and guests were then served a five course meal of trio of melon pools served with forest berry compote, leek and potato soup, roast strip loin of beef served with glazed shallots roasted potatoes seasonal vegetables, with a red wine jus and Yorkshire pudding. Followed by a baked New York cheesecake with blueberry compote and fresh tea and coffee with mints, to finish.

Before the main presentation, Mark thanked the club sponsors, BENZING - Gantner Pigeon Systems GmbH represented by Thomas Zimmermann and Jim Savage. Thomas and Jim then presented the six section winners with their Benzing clocking systems that they won at the first race from St Philbert.
