## The Provisional 1<sup>st</sup> Open BICC and BBC winners, Brunger & Warner of Wisborough

### The Provisional 1st Open CSCFC Peter Rixon of Reading

These three great clubs came together for this race, and it produced a birdage of some 5,300 birds. Many fanciers and officials have talked about clubs coming together for the good of the sport but there is a difference between talking and doing. The BICC, BBC and CSCFC have not only talked the talk, but they have walked the walk. This is the first of four planned joint races.


This race produced two overall winners, Brunger & Warner who won the BICC and BBC and Peter Rixon who won the CSCFC. This race report covers the Open and Section winners in all three clubs and is a combined report by Clare Norman and Mike Jackson.

#### The weather/race report

Steve Appleby, the BICC race and weather advisor, provided the following report:

Overall weather conditions for the combined organisations race from Nort-sur-Erdre were very good, due to the effects of high pressure extending across the flight path from the west. Liberation was effected at 06:30 under broken cloud and blue skies. The convoyers reported the birds cleared well into a mainly light northerly wind. The flight path through northern France was one of generally clear blue skies until the birds reached the channel where various cloud formations were identified over the open sea. Here the wind direction changed to a moderate west north westerly picking up in strength averaging speeds of 15 mph and more. Visibility recorded by the met buoys was 5 to 10 miles. Viewing the early times some excellent performances were achieved as the leading birds as expected were timed mainly into the east and central sections.

This report is based on member's first bird verifications and the final result may differ.

The Provisional BICC and BBC Open winners, winning a BENZING - Gantner Pigeon Systems GmbH system were Brunger & Warner of Wisborough over 252 miles on 1375. Delighted with their double National win, the partnership said, 'We would like to start by saying a big thank you to the BICC marking and convoying team, the birds returned in absolutely immaculate condition, a true credit to all involved. We are also made up with the Benzing clocking system as we were thinking of buying one a few weeks ago. This will be a great asset for us going forward.

Moving on to the race we entered 10 hopefuls for the BICC Nort-sur-Erdre then nominating over to the BBC and the 100 Club. The birds were liberated at 6.30am. While waiting for the birds we predicted a steady race with the northerly winds in France turning westly in the Channel. At 11.53am Number 40, a blue roundabout hen, appeared like a dot in the sky, spot on her racing line from France and finished in one fast dive into the loft and straight into her partner still looking completely fresh. She is a 2-year-old roundabout hen from a family of Maurice Matthews pigeons that were first acquired from one of Richard's lifelong friends, Roger Dawbarn some 25 years ago. He kindly gifted them from his directs that he had spent a considerable amount of money on. These pigeons have put up some very good performances over the years winning many club, fed, combine and now National level winning 1st Open BICC and 1st BBC.

Number 40, as she's currently known, has been a good pigeon over the water but saved her big performance for this weekend. Her mother and father are both very good pigeons. Her mother being a very consistent pigeon on land and water, winning various top prizes and scoring well up into the open and section from Sigogne last year in the NFC, on a very hard racing day. Her father was also a very good pigeon being a previous fed winner from Bordeaux and was then sent for his first ever north road race straight to Perth. Again, he didn't disappoint, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> with only 12 pigeons making it on the day. The weekend was one we will never forget as we also took the first 4 in the

federation for the fifth time this season! Once again, we thank the whole team behind the BICC and BBC as it's no easy task. We would also like to say a big well done to all on the result and all the section winners.'

#### **Central Southern Classic Flying Club Open and Section winners.**





#### The Provisional BICC & BBC Section Winners

**2<sup>nd</sup> South Centre Section, 8<sup>th</sup> Open BICC and 7<sup>th</sup> Open BBC was Derek Reid of Weybridge.** Derek said, 'Hi Mike, here are brief details of my pigeon, GB 21N 15019. Flown on the conventional widowhood system, this was his eight race of the season, with his previous best position being in the BBC Fougeres, where he was my second bird. Last year he was very consistent with 6 positions to the loft. His sire was bred by M&D Evans, a Vandebele. The grandsire on the dam's side was one of my best ever racing pigeons with 7 x firsts. A pigeon bred by Peter Sabba, a Fran Zwols when paired to a direct daughter of my NFC St Nazaire winner of 2005. She bred the mother of GB21N15019 and this was only his second Channel race in his career so far.'

1<sup>st</sup> South East Section, 2<sup>nd</sup> Open BICC and 2<sup>nd</sup> Open 1<sup>st</sup> Section BBC were J Topp & Mann of Rayleigh. The consistent loft report, 'First we would like to say a very well-done to all the section winners and big well-done to the Open winner on an outstanding pigeon. We are very happy with our performance, sending 3 widowhood cocks and the first one to come was a yearling cock bird. He was sent on pure widowhood and come like a bullet to take 2<sup>nd</sup> Open. What makes it even better, is that he is a mix of all the best race pigeons that I have retired to stock. Mainly Gaby based. The other 2 cocks were home not long after. The last one being at 14.33 so it turned out a good day's racing for us. Lastly, we would like to thank all involved, as the birds come home in excellent condition. Also, all my club mates who were on the result, it was a good performance by the Hullbridge members. There were a good few that featured in the Top 20 of the Open, so well-done all.'

 $2^{nd}$  South East Section,  $3^{rd}$  Open and  $4^{th}$  Open  $2^{nd}$  Section J BBC Mark Bulled of Harlow. Following on from his good performance form St Philbert, Mark said, 'Congratulations to the winners in what was a good testing race. My winning bird was a 2-year-old widowhood hen having her first Channel race. She is my best hen, and as a young bird she raced north and should have won the fed twice, but for poor trapping. She was turned north as a yearling and she won twice, including Wadebridge 234 miles. I thought a good time would be by 1.30 and was pleased to see her screaming in at 1.26 although from the wrong direction! Straight from the west. Her breeding is from my old Red Bull Soontjens. Her sire won  $4 \times 1^{st}$  and the dam was bred by GWP Macaloney. Herself a winner of  $5 \times 1^{st}$  for me. I sent 29 and had 24 on the day and 4 more Sunday morning.'

**3<sup>rd</sup> South East Section, 4<sup>th</sup> Open BICC were Mr & Mrs R Hume of Rochford over 304 miles on 1288.** Rob said, 'This bird has been a very consistent hen for me, she is a Herman hen, and this was her third race of the season. The other two races being from 118 miles and then into her first race across the Channel. She was racing back to the perch and come home in very good condition. In fact, it was her sister who was my second pigeon who will also feature quite high up in the result being a year younger than her. Also, well-done Mitch, on a very good bird it won't be long mate. '

4<sup>th</sup> South East Section, 5<sup>th</sup> Open BICC and 5<sup>th</sup> Open 3<sup>rd</sup> Sec G BBC were L & K Buddle of Dover. Lee reported, 'Our provisional 5<sup>th</sup> Open BICC, 4<sup>th</sup> ES is a yearling cock flown on our chaos widowhood system. He has had prior to the Nort-Sur-Erdre race, a BICC St Philbert, 265 miles where he was the 5<sup>th</sup> bird to the loft and most weeks inland with Wingham flying club from either Stoney Cross, 129 miles, or Blandford, 149 miles. His sire was bred by Mark Sparey and is an inbred G-Son of Mark Gilbert's Golden Barcelona with some, Kleine Jade 1<sup>st</sup> Int Barcelona of Jelle Jellema in the pedigree also. His dam was bred by Andrew Macmillan from a son of, Southfield Dream when she was paired to daughter of Perpignan-06, from Mark Gilbert. The dam of this hen is a direct Etienne Meirlaen hen. A granddaughter of Monar and Odilon Barcelona. This year has been our first season on the Cest Pharma products and both dad and I can really see a difference in the overall condition and fitness of the race team on these products. Congratulations to Brunger & Warner on their win and all in the result.'

6<sup>th</sup> South East Section, 9<sup>th</sup> Open BICC were P Jackson & Son of Bromley over 284 on 1261. Lee said, 'GB20N37961 is a blue pied hen provisionally 9<sup>th</sup> Open Nort Sure Erdre. Again, this day proved more difficult than anticipated with this hen being a great campaigner for us previously. Having been 20<sup>th</sup> Open NFC Coutances, 17<sup>th</sup> Open BICC Guernsey A/A, 18<sup>th</sup> Open BICC Guernsey A/A, 65<sup>th</sup> Open BICC Alencon, 1<sup>st</sup> club, 1<sup>st</sup> Thames North & Eastern Counties Weymouth, 1<sup>st</sup> club, 26<sup>th</sup> TNEC Weymouth. She is a cracking hen, a granddaughter of, The Outlaw Cock, 1<sup>st</sup> NFC Fougeres 6,726 birds when paired to Silent Lady, 1<sup>st</sup> BICC Guernsey OH. On the dam's side, she is a direct granddaughter of the super couple of ours, 192 X 928 Bartels. These lines are responsible for our 1<sup>st</sup> Open NFC Coutances. She will now be retired to the stock loft.'

#### **The BICC Provisional South West Section Winners**


1<sup>st</sup> South West Section, 50<sup>th</sup> Open Mark Sparey of Abertillery over 305 miles on 1195. Mark told me, 'I timed a blue yearling cock that has raced the Channel three times this season with the BICC. His sire is Rhiwparc Tomos, who won the GGDC from Agen twice, over 550 miles. His dam is a daughter of Rhiwparc Relentless, who scored three times from NFC Tarbes, winning the WSRN along the way. He was paired with a sister of Mark Gilbert's Marseille cock. Rhiwparc Tomos and Relentless are half-brothers and both grandchildren of Southfield supreme.'

**2<sup>nd</sup> South West Section, 52<sup>nd</sup> Open was G Treharne & Son of Nantyglo over 309 miles on 1193.3**. Stuart said, 'My bird is a 3-year-old blue, white flight hen flown on the roundabout system. She is bred from a grandson of Topstar and a daughter of Alan's Lad when he was paired to Lady Kain, 1<sup>st</sup> National Messac, and is the nestmate to the father of the NFC Ace Pigeon 2023. She has been a consistent bird and among other prizes she scored 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 70<sup>th</sup> Open NFC Sigogne in 2023. This season, she has flown well and was 1<sup>st</sup> Open Welsh South Road National, 7<sup>th</sup> Open BICC Alencon 6,196 birds. She was a bit off the place in St Philbert being 223<sup>rd</sup> Open 5,037 birds, but as you can see a real consistent top performer.'

**3<sup>rd</sup> South West Section, 53<sup>rd</sup> Open was Simon Smith of Pontypool over 304 miles on 1193.0.** Simon Smith of Pontypool took third spot to complete the 1,2 and 3 for the Welsh fanciers in the section. Simon timed a Vandenabeele blue hen of shadow bloodlines, flown on the roundabout system.

Simon took 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Open in the Welsh Continental Classic Club from Fougeres on 19<sup>th</sup> May and this good section position in the BICC, adds to his impressive season so far.

She is bred from my Luc Herbots pigeons, being a granddaughter of Iron Barca Lady, 1<sup>st</sup> provincial, 1<sup>st</sup> local, 16<sup>th</sup> National and 23<sup>rd</sup> International Barcelona and 8<sup>th</sup> International hens. She is a half-sister to Lady Narbonne and half-sister to New Mimi. Finally, I'd like to say a big thank you to Clare our fantastic secretary and Kevin Foster for the wonderful job he does at the marking station, and his crew.

**8<sup>th</sup> Open Tony Meader of Benfleet.** My good Vandenabeele 2-year-old which is 3<sup>rd</sup> J section and 8<sup>th</sup> Open provisionally. A great asset to my small team this was his 3<sup>rd</sup> National this year and has been my first bird on each occasion, his parents and mate have also raced with him on each race. He will be rested until Messac now which will be his last Channel race of 2024. Well done to all the people in the result and congratulations to Brunger & Warner of Billinghurst.
