

## Dax International Provisional Race Report

# 14<sup>th</sup> July 2024

The fourth International took place from Dax on 14<sup>th</sup> July. Dax is a French city that was established by the Romans, and is today known as a spa destination, specialising in mud treatment for rheumatism and similar ailments. Dax is also known for its bullfighting culture, especially during the August ferias, one of the most crowded festival events in France with 800,000 people attending over five days.

At 6.10am on Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> July 8,566 pigeons were liberated into broken cloud and blue skies with light winds varying from east to southwest for the journey through France. The UK contingent consisted of 153 birds sent by 33 members. Each Section sent the following: South Centre, 14 members sent 53 birds, South East 13 sent 66 and in the South West, 6 members sent 34 pigeons.


This report is based on member's verifications and the final result may differ.

1<sup>st</sup> South East Section, 1<sup>st</sup> Open was Catalin Olaru of Romford over 551 miles on 865. Catalin was also 4<sup>th</sup> Section, 4<sup>th</sup> Open on 791.

Catalin's hen was raced on the natural system and was sent sitting on 10-day old eggs. She had a few races with the North Thames and Southern Club, and she flew St. Just and Fontenay with the East of England Club. The long-distance bloodlines are evident in the yearling's pedigree. Catalin also took 4<sup>th</sup> Open on 791.

#### **The Provisional South East Section Winners**

2<sup>nd</sup> South East Section, 2<sup>nd</sup> Open & 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 3<sup>rd</sup> Open were G M Preece & Son of Dover over 529 miles on 812 & 810. The ever consistent, long distance champion loft of Geoff and Clayton Preece timed, The Dax Devil, a small light chequer cock. He's one of our main pigeons in the race team having already raced from Barcelona twice and Perpignan three times. He is a direct daughter of our main breeding hen, The 168 (Wiggins half-sister) which makes him a half-brother to our 48 cock who was 2<sup>nd</sup> National Perpignan 2023. His father is the nest brother to our, Sunny Jim, 1<sup>st</sup> National Perpignan 2019.

Third National is one of our 2-year-old cocks on his first international race. He has one white flight at the end of his right wing just like his great-grandfather Jack Jones. His make up is 25% Bill Woodall's Dragon's Boy, 1<sup>st</sup> National Barcelona 2001 (Wiggins Grandfather) + 270 lines, 50% Raymund Hermes 270 lines through Barcelona 05 and 25% our own Jack Jones x Wiggins line, which also originates from the Stoffel Gr.Ophoff 270 lines. We are very happy with the whole teams' strong performance from this race after another challenging race for the UK. The whole team is raced on widowhood and will fly daily 1 hour plus in the morning and 1 hour plus in the evening happily.

#### **The Provisional South Centre Section Winners**

1<sup>st</sup> South Centre Section, 5<sup>th</sup> Open & 2<sup>nd</sup> Section, 6<sup>th</sup> Open was Mark Gilbert of Winkfield, Windsor, over 537 miles on753 & 748. Congratulations to Catalin Olaru for winning the race with his fantastic yearling. We thought we could get day pigeons on Sunday night into the UK, but as seems to be the norm this season nothing made it home, so it was an early morning alarm call again. Something must have stopped them from coming across as there didn't seem to be any reason they would not do the same speeds as the birds being clocked in Europe. We have had reports there was heavy rain in France but not confirmed.

We sent four 2-year-old pigeons back that went to Pau on the 24<sup>th</sup> June and sent 18 yearling hens from the yearling loft that came so well Saturday from Bordeaux. We thought as the yearling cocks were buzzing Saturday out of Bordeaux the hens would make a good job of this today. They didn't, and we think it just goes to show the lack of experience pulling out of thousands of pigeons going the wrong direction, has shown just how hard international racing is, especially if you don't have the right team in. We were extremely disappointed with the returns on Monday as we had only clocked 8 out of the 25 sent.

Our first two timed will be provisionally 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> Section, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> Open. The first pigeon in the clock is a 2-year-old cock that was 32<sup>nd</sup> Open Pau on the 24<sup>th</sup> June and last year was 26<sup>th</sup> Grand National NFC Tarbes as a yearling. He is from a son of Hellas, 4<sup>th</sup> Nat Limoges and 7<sup>th</sup> National Bergerac and a daughter of, New Witbuik, 1<sup>st</sup> National, 6<sup>th</sup> International Barcelona 2012. Our second timer is a yearling hen from a son of Jef, 1<sup>st</sup> International Barcelona 16,051b 2019 paired to a daughter of Southfield Hugo, 1<sup>st</sup> National Perpignan 2017, 1<sup>st</sup> National Barcelona 2018 and Willeke, 1<sup>st</sup> International St Vincent 10,597b 2019.

**3**<sup>rd</sup> **South Centre Section, 7**<sup>th</sup> **Open was Fred Hall & Dtrs of Worthing over 495 miles on 725.** My blue widowhood cock, Foxgrove Consistent, taking 3<sup>rd</sup> Centre Section, 7<sup>th</sup> Open from Dax has put up a string of previous top performances. 7<sup>th</sup> Open BICC St Vincent, 28<sup>th</sup> Open BICC Pau, 91<sup>st</sup> Open BICC Pau, 20<sup>th</sup> Open BBC St Philbert, 47<sup>th</sup> Open BBC Tarbes, 180<sup>th</sup> Open BBC Guernsey, 23<sup>rd</sup> Open BBC St Philbert, 181<sup>st</sup> Open BICC St Philbert, 32<sup>nd</sup> Open NFC St Philbert, 195<sup>th</sup> Open NFC Tarbes. His breeding is Carteus x Syndicate lofts always raced on the widowhood system and from these performances, he has deserved his name as consistent!

#### **The Provisional South West Section Winners**

1st South West Section, 18th Open & 3rd Section, 22nd Open were D & J Staddon of Ditcheat over 519 miles on 688 & 666. Provisional 1st & 3rd West Section are Dave & John Staddon of Ditcheat. Dave reported, 'Congratulations to Catalin Olaru on his win and to all section winners and everyone who clocked on yet another difficult long-distance race this year. We can never remember a season where returns have been so challenging for most lofts. We are delighted to win the section again with a yearling cock flown on Chaos Widowhood and fed on Bamford's Staddon Chaos Mix. This yearling has been very consistent and currently sits close to the top of the NFC ace pigeons for the season. He is bred from one of our best pairs. Winters Gem x Blue Gem making him a full brother of Fahrenheit 4th Sec, 24th Nat Pau & 1st Sec, 2nd Nat Rieux Minervois and also Gemini 1st Sec, 4th Open NFC Tarbes, 1st Sec, 1st Open CSCFC Tarbes, 1st Sec, 1st Open BBC Tarbes and 2nd Sec, 11th Open BICC Perpignan. He will now be put away for next season.

Our second pigeon was our No 1 fancy. This 2-year-old cock flown on Chaos Widowhood has already won 21<sup>st</sup> Sec, 26<sup>th</sup> Nat BICC St Philbert 2797 birds 2023, he was disqualified from winning 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 11<sup>th</sup> Nat BICC St Vincent on the day because we mistakenly did a full Benzing clock evaluation after our first two, day birds before he arrived late on the day, this 520-mile race was flown as a yearling. This year he was 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 39<sup>th</sup> Nat BICC Pau in a very hard race to the west of the UK & 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 22<sup>nd</sup> National BICC Dax. In preparation, he has flown Carentan CSCFC, Alencon BICC, Fougeres NFC, St Philbert BICC, Messac NFC, Maidstone Three Counties, Pau BICC & Dax BICC. He is now being prepared for his 3<sup>rd</sup> International race of the season from Perpignan where he will bid to match our champion race cock BRB who won 27<sup>th</sup> Pau, 4<sup>th</sup> St Vincent & 5<sup>th</sup> Perpignan in 2023. We are in the early stages of trying to build a family that will consistently race at 500/600/700 miles three times in one season. The early signs are positive. He is 100% Staddon pigeon and is bred from 2 x 2022 late-breds we put to stock. Mercury Rising, the sire is from Fahrenheit 23<sup>rd</sup> Nat Pau & 2<sup>nd</sup> Nat Rieux Minervois in 2020 x Celsius 15<sup>th</sup> Nat Pau & 3<sup>rd</sup> Nat Rieux Minervois, so it's already in his blood to be able to do repeat trips to the internationals. The mother is from Gemstone, 1<sup>st</sup> Sec, 7<sup>th</sup> Nat NFC Tarbes x Miss St Vincent 1<sup>st</sup> Sec, 3<sup>rd</sup> Nat BICC St Vincent. We have now named him Kelvin'.

2<sup>nd</sup> South West Section, 20<sup>th</sup> Open & 4<sup>th</sup> Section, 26<sup>th</sup> Open was Nick Stevens of North Perrott over 503 miles on 677 & 599. Congratulations to the winners, and to Dave and John on winning the Section. My dark chequer cock flew St Vincent last year and this year went to St Philbert and Nortsur-Edre with the BICC. He then went to Brighton and Eastbourne with the West of England Combine, 8 days before basketing for Brighton with the 3 Counties. He's bred from the race team and of the great Padfield family ancestry. Fed on Versa-Laga with quill boost in the water.
