Perpignan (Tuchan) International Provisional Race Report

5th August 2024


In 2023 the Perpignan race took place on 7th August, following a 3-day holdover and the birds were moved to Elne. The story was a similar one this year. The liberation point was changed to a place called Tuchan and the birds were again held over for 3 days. This year they were liberated on Monday 5th August at 6.00am.

A total of 14,148 birds were basketed from the six countries competing. With France sending 4,041, Netherlands 4,363, Luxembourg 23, Germany 665, Belgium 4,848 and 210 pigeons from the UK, sent by the BICC.

Each Section sent the following: In the South Centre Section, 16 members sent 89 birds, South East 18 members sent 144, South West 2 sent 5 and in the North Centre 1 member sent 2 birds. In total 40 members sent the 210 birds to compete in the final International of the season.

The Provisional Open and 1st South Centre Section winner was Mark Gilbert of Winkfield, Windsor over 612 miles on 895. Mark was also 7th Open & 10th Open, 2nd & 4th South Centre Section on 806 & 760. Perpignan (Tuchan) was the final old bird race of the season and as has been the way with all Channel racing this year, this was another tough race. Due to the weather conditions, we did not think that there would be day birds, but we did keep one eye on the loft Monday night just in case - as you never know with pigeons, they can surprise you.

There were no day pigeons, so it was a 5am start at the loft Tuesday morning. The weather started off nice in the morning and we even had blue sky and sunshine for a while, but that soon turned to full cloud cover and then rain for a lot of the day. We sent 12 pigeons which consisted of 3 pigeons that already went to the Pau/Tarbes this season and 9 that had been to Barcelona a month ago. We were confident in their ability but wondered what Barcelona would have taken out of them.

At 9.20am our blue hen, Two Nine One, came out of the east to provisionally win 1st National flying the 612-mile course with a velocity of 895ypm. This hen was also 2nd Section, 4th National BICC Perpignan last year. She seems to like this race point. She was due to go to Barcelona, but we missed sending her and so she went to the Tarbes NFC instead, where she was our sixth pigeon, scoring 11th Section, 53rd National. Incidentally she had the Tarbes NFC last year before Perpignan and scored 14th Section, 46th National. Her father is, Kanibaal Barcelona, 1st Province 2500b, 4th International Barcelona 25,750b 2010 and 26th International Perpignan 16,921b 2012. Her mother is a double granddaughter of Golden Barcelona the 2014 Gold Wing winner from Barcelona and father of Southfield Hugo, Southfield Gold Lady and grandfather of Southfield Gold.

We clocked another 4 pigeons during the day at 11.33, 12.53, 19.13 and 20.22 and so the overall team performance stood at 1st, 2nd, 4th, 7th & 8th Section and 1st, 7th, 10th, 21st and 23rd National.

Our second on the clock is a special hen and she has pulled out all the stops this year. She returned at 11.33 to score 2nd Section, 7th National but she also won the Greater Distance Single Bird NFC as she was our nomination. This is not her only good performance this year, as last month she was 1st Section, 1st Open BBC Barcelona and 2nd Section, 2nd National BICC Barcelona, 698 miles. She is from a son of Kees Droog's Blue Champion x Rozalynn paired to a daughter of Jelle's Jack & Dafne.

The rest were as follows: Third - 4th section, 10th National, from a son of New Laureaat, 1st International Barcelona and a daughter of Golden Barcelona. Last month scored 8th Section, 13th Open BBC Barcelona, 14th Section, 22nd National BICC Barcelona. Fourth - 7th section, 21st National. A grandchild of Southfield Iron Man, 1st National BICC Perpignan 2018, 2nd National BICC Marseille 2018, 7th National BICC Palamos 2018 x Southfield Dark Star, 1st National BICC St Vincent and also a grandchild of Golden Barcelona. Last month scored 4th section, 6th Open BBC Barcelona and 5th section, 9th National BICC Barcelona. Fifth - 8th section, 23rd National. Father is Southfield King, 1st Grand National NFC Pau 2020 paired to a daughter of Lloyd, 1st International Barcelona 2018. Last month scored 5th section, 7th Open BBC Barcelona and 7th section, 12th National BICC Barcelona. We timed two more arrivals and had 7 from 12 home.





2nd Open, 3rd Open & 4th Open, 1st 2nd & 3rd South East Section, were G M Preece & Son of Dover over 576 miles on 892, 877 & 867. The partnership was also 8th Open and timed a fantastic 17 birds in race time.

The details of their first 3 birds are:

2nd National - GB 21 D 04157 widowhood cock, 5th National St. Vincent 2023(on the day) 8th National Barcelona 2024. 100% Raymund Hermes bloodline, inbred to Barcelona 05 (270) on the father's side. Barcelona 05 (270) on the mother's side as well. Jubilar on both sides of the pedigree. Very similar breeding to our Jubilee Barcelona, 1st National Barcelona 2022.

3rd National - GB 22 D 25135 lesbian hen sitting 7-day old eggs, this year she was sent to Pau arriving in 79th position and then flown off the loft until Perpignan. Her sire was a good solid performance cock for us, himself being a grandson of Bernd Morsnowski's, De Blauwe 212. Her mother is inbred to our 168 breeding hen (Wiggins half-sister) 22.135 is also a granddaughter to our first arrival from Perpignan 2021 (06:30am day 2).

4th National - GB 21 D 04122 raced to his box all year not allowing any pigeons near (even the females) this year he has already been 27th National Barcelona 2024 and was full of himself after arriving from both races this year. His father is a direct Detlef Devers pigeon 50% Bernd Morsnowski blood. The mother is a direct Raymund Hermes, great-granddaughter to the 270 Golden Barcelona.



5th Open, 4th South East Section, L & K Buddle of Dover over 563 miles on 853. The partnership timed a 5-year-old cock, now called, Brock. He has been flown on our Widowhood Chaos System all season long. He has had the following races this year: 3 x inland to 130 miles, BICC Alencon 194 miles, BICC St Philbert 267 miles and the BICC Pau International 545 miles where he was also within the prize result. 3 x 65-mile trainers were given in the last 2 weeks before BICC Perpignan marking. He is from the best Brockamp bloodlines like Euro Diamond & Perpignan-06 with the sire coming from Tim Webster and the dam from Nigel Langstaff.





6th Open, 5th South East Section was Spencer & Sarah Nicholson racing as J Nicholson & Son of Rochester over 571 miles on 831. They clocked their 5-year-old red hen, sent feeding a small youngster. She was 22nd Open Pau earlier in the season and has flown 6 international races in the last 3 seasons. She is a half-sister to their second bird in this race and contains all the old Nicholson bloodlines. Their second bird was an 8-year-old hen, who is provisionally 31st Open Perpignan, was also 21st Open Pau earlier in the season and has been a previous section winner from Pau.

9th Open, 3rd South Centre Section was Mannor Lofts of Southampton over 589 miles on 783.

Firstly, we would like to congratulate Mark Gilbert on winning a difficult race, especially as he wasn't in the most favourable position. Our provisional 9th Open, 3rd CS Section bird from Perpignan is a 3-year-old hen who was on her first babies of the year, being sent on 2-day old youngsters. She was also our first bird from BICC Pau as well, being 57th Open.

Her breeding is just what you need for these kinds of races. Her sire was bred by Mark Gilbert and is a grandson of New Laureaat and Zwart Goud, Silvie is also very prominent in her sire's side. The dam was bred by Roger Philips from Guernsey and is inbred to New Laureaat and Kleine Jade.

As a young bird this hen had one race on the North Road from Ilkeston 150 miles and took 10 days to return home. As a yearling on her first trip across the Channel from Guernsey she was missing for 19 days with no more racing that season. As a two-year-old, she became much more reliable arriving on the second day from BICC St Vincent 504 miles. Unfortunately, we had the clock struck off at lunchtime, so her arrival wasn't registered. We have had a difficult year, so this has given us a nice lift.
