

## The weather/race report

Steve Appleby, the BICC race and weather advisor, provided the following report:

The weather forecast for our final race this season could not have been better. The high pressure centered over northern France was responsible for fine conditions which extended across most of England and France. Liberation was affected at 08:00 hours under almost cloudless skies (see photo at site.) The convoy cleared the race point immediately. Winds were very light overland in northern France mainly from the southeast changing to southerly over the Channel but became more active over the open sea reaching speeds of 12 mph. Over southern England the main wind influence was from the southwest. Visibility in the Channel was very good, recorded at 11 miles plus. Early times indicate a good race for all organisations competing.

## **YOUNG BIRD REPORT**

BICC - 1<sup>st</sup> Open, 1<sup>st</sup> South Centre Section Dave 'Wicky' Bullen & Son of Croydon. GB24V07750, the National winner is now called Ethan Sunshine Boy. A darkness blue hen that was sent paired to a young cock but, she had not laid an egg at the time of sending. Her breeding is from our good friend Ray Roberts, who seems to have the knack of breeding BICC winners, because this is his 3<sup>rd</sup> BICC winner. He has bred 1 for himself and 2 for us. She was raced on dad's unique feeding system containing popcorn maze and sunflower hearts. She was trained hard by Ray, out to Millford, 2-3 times a week, which is 30 miles. She's been very consistent this year being 6<sup>th</sup> club Wincanton, 5<sup>th</sup> club Kingsdown and 1<sup>st</sup> club Oakhampton the week before winning the BICC

National. We would like to thank Tom Firminger and the Higham marking station for all their hard work and we are delighted with the win. We were also taken by complete surprise when she arrived so quickly!

GB24C00051. This blue cock bird was purchased at the Southampton BICC Breeder Buyer sale. The breeder was David Paine of St Neots and we would like to thank him for allowing us to purchase his bird at the auction! David has told me that the bird was bred from Gladwin & Jarvis & Family, their amazing Franz Zwols bloodlines. The pigeon had only raced two races from Stoney Cross with the WOESRC together with three training tosses from Holmsley. For the last two training sessions he was the first bird back to the loft and appeared to be very keen, but we were not entirely sure with the short preparation races (47 miles maximum) that he would be able to fly the Channel successfully, but he certainly proved us all wrong!

We would like to thank the convoyers Chris Withers and Pat Harris for looking after the birds so well and of course all the thanks in the world to Clare and Martin Norman for their tireless hard work all year in very difficult circumstances. This year has ended on a real high for us mainly because Clare has beaten her cancer and now, we have won our first Open race from the Channel, we could not ask for more!

The sire is a Vandenabeele cock, that raced well for us and he's a grandson of New Bliksem.

**BICC** - 1<sup>st</sup> South East Section, 3<sup>rd</sup> Open were J Clarke & Dtr Of Selling. Jamie's young bird had 9 races up to 180 miles, before this trip to France. It's bred from Mikey Collins' pigeons that have proven to be fantastic pigeons for him and his friends. They have been winning out of turn, so a big thank you to Mark and Mikey for their help.

**BICC - 3<sup>rd</sup> South East Section, 5<sup>th</sup> Open was Lee Bastone of Burnham on Crouch.** Congratulations to all the winners. My first bird is from Shadows Image x Formula One Prince and Dreamy, who looks like she's won the Thames Gold Ring race! My second pigeon, just 18 seconds later, is from Peter Fox of the Junior lines. Again, of the Gabby's crossed with Prince and Dreamy.

CSCFC/BBC / BICC – 2<sup>nd</sup> Open 2<sup>nd</sup> NW Section CSCFC, 1<sup>st</sup> Section C 5<sup>th</sup> Open BBC & 2<sup>nd</sup> South West Section, 16<sup>th</sup> Open BICC, Fab Barresi of Peasedown St John. Fab timed a chequer hen GB24D31114. The sire is a Dave Atkins x Van den Bulck and the dam is 100% Geoff and Catherine Cooper, mainly George lines. It's been sent to every combine race apart from the first one. She was sent to the CSCFC race on a 7-day old chick. The last two weeks she started to show a bit of form so was sent with the expectation of doing well. Congratulations to Clive, Jill and Neil on winning the race and a big thank you to Clare for all her hard work in what was a difficult season for her.

BBC –  $3^{rd}$  Open  $2^{nd}$  Section J, John Cowlin of Hockley. First YB is a Frans Zwols and the same way bred as his first bird from BICC Guernsey YB this year, the sire is a special cock we put to stock being direct from the wonder that is Amor. Amor is 19 years old and still alive. Not only was he a big winner on the road but has been a world class breeder, being the sire of Dreamy among many others. The dam of this YB was put to stock after breaking her legs badly when racing, that has turned into a blessing in disguise as she is breeding good birds each year. In turn she is from the Amal cock and Guernsey Princess both big winners and parents of 2 x  $1^{st}$  National and  $2^{nd}$  National winners.

CSCFC / BICC – 3<sup>rd</sup> Open 3<sup>rd</sup> NW Section CSCFC & 3<sup>rd</sup> South West Section, 23<sup>rd</sup> Open BICC, Stuart Wilcox of Bristol. I timed a blue w/f cock now called Home Alone. Last week he was 1<sup>st</sup> Section G and provisionally 32<sup>nd</sup> Open NFC Falaise 204 miles, being the only bird home on the day in section. This week from 222 miles he won 3<sup>rd</sup> Section 3<sup>rd</sup> Open Classic and 3<sup>rd</sup> West Section in the BICC. I didn't intend to send him this week and in fact left for the marking station, however I realized I had little chance of a good result without sending him, so I returned home to get him. He is 75% Koen Minderhoud and 25% Rik Hermans from his Friendship Line 1<sup>st</sup> National Chateauroux 44105b. His mother is a dtr of Super 221, multiple Fed winner and 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Open National BICC, she is a dtr of Amigo and Miss Turbo. The father is from Kliene Turbo (Brother Miss Turbo) when paired to a daughter of Special K (son Geeloger) and a dtr of Prince Esmee. The birds are fed on Beyers Verkerk Sport and Verkerk Light with Koopman All-in-One added on Fridays, all supplied by Countrywide.

BBC / BICC – 4<sup>th</sup> Open 2<sup>nd</sup> Section D BBC & 3<sup>rd</sup> South Centre Section, 12<sup>th</sup> Open BICC, Mark Gilbert of Windsor. Congratulations to Dave Bullen and Son for winning the BICC and Ken Wise for winning the BBC. Fougeres was our last race of the season with the British International Championship Club and British Barcelona Club. The birds were liberated at 8.00am under almost clear skies with winds very light southeast at the race point and changing to southerly in the channel and southwest over the mainland. The conditions were right for a really nice race for the youngsters which was a change from all the terrible weather we have had for Channel racing this year. We thought that as they had made decent work of the bad weather in recent weeks, they should take this in their stride with the experience they have had.

We started off the morning with a nice breakfast at our local farm shop and Troy, Darran and I were joined there by Roger Lowe and Luke Oglesby. After much chat about times we decided that a decent pigeon would be just over the 4 hour mark so at 11.00am we headed back home as we also had a club race from Truro with the Berkshire Federation.

With both races being around 216 miles and the Truro birds being released 15 minutes later we realised the birds would be coming home roughly the same time, so it would be hard to know which was which before they went through the trap. Around 12.04 we had birds coming up the field but realised in an instant it was the Truro birds as we sent 58 and had 30 come together and that definitely wasn't going to happen from Fougeres!

We didn't have to wait long though as at 12.11 we had 6 birds diving all over the sky full of flying heading to the lofts. They were from Fougeres and once they landed all went through the trap in seconds. The second bird, clocked two seconds after the first, was our all pooler and the third bird clocked, again two seconds later, was last week's 1<sup>st</sup> Section, 3<sup>rd</sup> National NFC Falaise.

Our first pigeon on the clock provisionally scored 2<sup>nd</sup> Section, 4<sup>th</sup> Open British Barcelona Club & 3<sup>rd</sup> Section, 12<sup>th</sup> Open British International Championship Club with a velocity of 1509ypm for the 216-mile journey. With the 6 birds being clocked together

the other 6 should figure highly in the result too. We were really pleased how the whole team performed yesterday as we sent 83 and had around 50 in the first hour and 61/83 back in total.



The Marcelis was a gift bird from friend & club mate Shaun McDonough, & the Vanbruaene from A.H. Bennett stock. This has been a successful pairing this year as the nest mate won from Guernsey 2 weeks ago & was my 4<sup>th</sup> bird home in this race. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the open winner D Bullen, the NC section winner Freddie Bannister, and thank the BICC for providing good racing in season, that has had more bad weather than good. Also, for providing the opportunity for Midland flyers to compete via Richard Chambers and the Rugely marking station.

A double National winner! Champion DE104 is bred from sire Champion DE680. He has bred over 16 first prize winners. He is from Brave x Little Star. They are from the lines of Nieuwe Rossi Eenooraske DiCaprio x Kannibaal. Her Dam is a daughter of Champion Foxy Lady x Propere Rik. Both champions in their own right. Foxy Lady only raced 3 times and was 1<sup>st</sup> sec, 1<sup>st</sup> open, 1<sup>st</sup> sec, 3<sup>rd</sup> open, and 1<sup>st</sup> sec, 3<sup>rd</sup> open. Propere Rik is sire, g-sire & gg-sire of many winners (too long to list). Both parents were bred by Peter Fox of Syndicate Lofts. Out of the three clubs combined for this race, Champion DE104 took the top spot overall.





Her other previous performances are: BICC Alencon 26<sup>th</sup> Open, 11<sup>th</sup> May 2024; Newbold Verdon 1<sup>st</sup> Club 6<sup>th</sup> Fed, 20<sup>th</sup> August 2023 and Stratford upon Avon 1<sup>st</sup> Club 3<sup>rd</sup> Fed on 16<sup>th</sup> September 2023.

Farm Ivy was paired to a daughter of Evie, 2<sup>nd</sup> International hens, 10<sup>th</sup> International St Vincent.

BBC / BICC – 2<sup>nd</sup> Open 1<sup>st</sup> Section J BBC & 1<sup>st</sup> South East Section, 2<sup>nd</sup> Open BICC, John Cowlin of Hockley. John had a super race with 3 hens in 4 minutes. First hen has been a good pigeon, she was 2<sup>nd</sup> Section, 53<sup>rd</sup> Open NFC in 2023 as a YB beat by a loft mate by 4 seconds in a very strong east wind. In 2024 she won 1<sup>st</sup> Hullbridge club from Stonycross and now 2<sup>nd</sup> Open BBC and BICC National. CSCFC – 1st NE Section Jamie Everied of Reading. Jamie timed GB24B33872 over 215 miles on 1359.875.


